







### A Busy Week in Hanslope School!






Year 3 looked at technology in the past and compared it to now and then they spoke about how it might change again in the future when the children are older. They spoke through some ideas and shared them with their class.

how to make us smile




Two examples of some Year 6 posters which are now on display in UKS2.

Did vou know,

If your child finishes the year with **95% attendance** they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around **55 hours of learning time**?

In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing **20%**, with their weekly attendance sitting at just **80%**.


