## Our Student Spokesperson's Column this Week:

$\mathcal{A}$ s it was World Book Day last week, in Year 5 we Cooked at the amazing case of Jonathan Bryan; Jonathan Bryan is a ten-year-old boy who is disabled and has cerebral palsy, which means he cannot control his arm, leg and mouth muscles. $\mathcal{N}$ ot being able to speak or walk, Jonathan felt as if he was trapped away for years.
$\mathcal{H i s}$ mother trained him to use a special board which aflowed others to understand what he was saying. His social life rose immediately. $\mathcal{A}$ lot of people who were disabled in recent history were not taught to read and write, so Jonathan met the minister for vulnerable children in education to change the way disabled people, like Jonathan, are taught. Later on, he meets his 'star': Michael Morpurgo. Jonathan was glad to finally be 'free.'
$\mathcal{A}$ s this month is Women's History Month,' which we are Cearning a lot about in Hawthorn, I will be sharing one inspirational female figure from

History every week this March. Next up it is Isabelfa I. Born in 1451,
Isabella was the daughter of King Juan II of Castile and Isabel of Portugal. Isabella's father died at a young age - only three years old! She went away with her mother where she had a good education. All those years ago, marriage was not used for love, Gut was arranged for a 'good' title for people. When her half-brother, King Henry, declared Isabella as his heiress, European princes rushed to marry her. Ignoring the King's wishes, she Gravely married Ferdinand of $\mathcal{A}$ ragon, who was her favourite. Isabella and Ferdinand wanted to take over all of Spain, which meant war began. Isabella wasn't always known for being kind and for years, Spain fived under these strict rules. Isabella was a strong ruler, but made some unusual choices. She also encouraged equal education. She helped Spain when women were followers, not leaders.

If your child finishes the year with $95 \%$ attendance they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around $\mathbf{5 5}$ hours of learning time?
In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing $\mathbf{2 0 \%}$, with their weekly attendance sitting at just $\mathbf{8 0 \%}$.
Remember: every day counts!

We also did a national Literacy sports quiz! There were a range of questions about books, literacy and football. Finally, we celebrated by designing our own t shirts. We had lots of amazing designs and it was something we were proud to show to our peers. It was a great discussion point for favourite books.

In Year 5 we also completed some shared reading activities with Foundation both sets of children thoroughly enjoyed it, and Year 5 particularly enjoyed sharing some picture books and stories. Across Year 5, we had 14 competition entries, which were all worth celebrating - they looked incredible and were on display outside of UKS2 classes all week - the teachers enjoyed having a good nose at them too! We took part in a live webinar, with Michael Morpurgo, which fascinated the children as he shared extracts of his work and also his own personal back-story too. On the afternoon of Book Day, Year 5 children looked at graphic novel examples and created their own comic strip based on an innovated character - some of these were so impressive, they'll be used as display work! Finally, we learnt about Jonathan Bryan - an inspiration 10-yearold who is non-verbal, but is writing a book. Read more about that from our Student Newsletter Editor! We also took part in the 'Guess the Teacher' activity which was set up in the library, where we had to match a baby photo of a teacher with their favourite childhood book. What a fabulous week we had!


## Book Week Continued!

Year 6 have really enjoyed Book Week, starting with sharing books with Year 2. On World Book Day itself, the children created a book shelf with their wonderful book covers. Miss Hudson and Mrs Lovegood were most impressed with their creativity. The pupils took part in a live lesson/webinar with Michael Morpurgo, where we learnt all about the author's top writing tips and where he gets his inspiration from. The webinar was linked to 'The Butterfly Lion' and we also found out a great deal of information about all the work the 'Born Free' charity does. One of the highlights was hearing Michael Morpurgo read an extract from the book! Our last activity was linked to poetry and the work of Joseph Coelho, the Children's Laureate. The children performed a range of his poems to their peers, using a range of performance devices.
