Did you know...

If your child finishes the year with 95% attendance they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around 55 hours of learning time?

In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing 20%, with their weekly attendance sitting at just 80%.

Remember: every day counts!

UKS2's learning this half-term

This term, our Year 5 and 6 pupils have enjoyed a vibrant and enriching series of activities exploring *Día de los Muertos*, the Mexican 'Day of the Dead' celebration. We began by learning about the history and traditions behind the festival, gaining an appreciation for how different cultures honour remembrance through their *ofrendas*.

In English, students produced some truly fabulous descriptive writing inspired by the colours, symbolism and atmosphere of the event. Our Religious Education sessions linked seamlessly with Year 6's topic on religious and cultural world views, allowing pupils to reflect on how communities around the world celebrate life and remember loved ones.

To further immerse ourselves, we took part in Spanish sessions focused on the festival's key vocabulary and customs. Finally, pupils expressed their creativity through art, studying symmetry and design before creating their own brightly coloured skull masks.

It has been a wonderfully cross-curricular learning experience—full of colour, culture and creativity!


Year 4's DT project!
