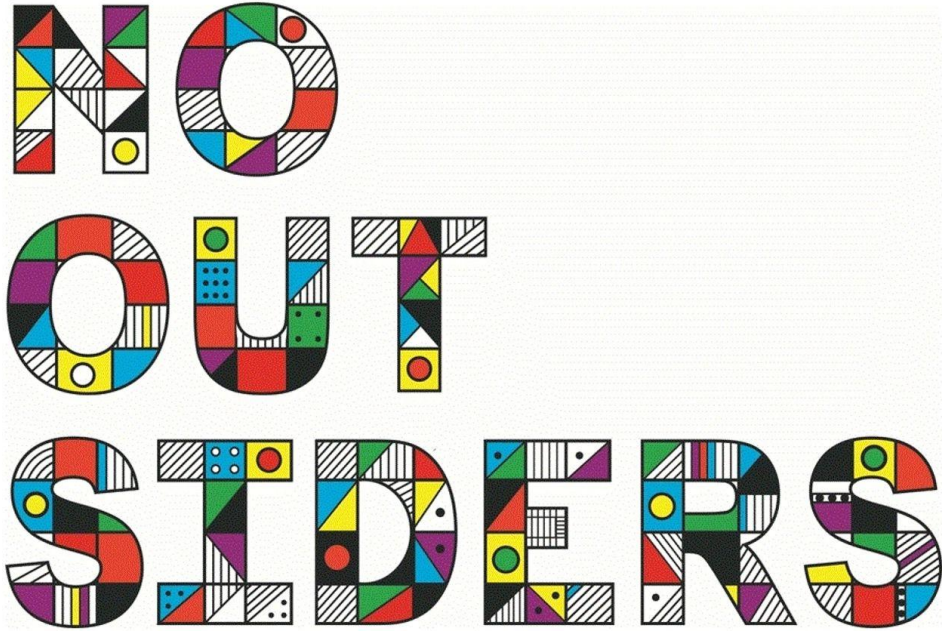

Why Blindfolds?

Lucy's Reason

Lucy is blind. She wanted her guests to experience what it feels like to be in her shoes. Wearing blindfolds helped everyone understand her world a little better.



A Touching Moment

Feeling the Dress

After the guests took off their blindfolds, Lucy's partner Cave kept his on. He wanted to feel the textures of Lucy's dress, just like Lucy did when she first wore it. This helped him understand why Lucy chose that special dress.



Seeing Without Sight

Lucy's Message

Lucy says, "You don't need eyesight to have vision. You don't need eyesight to have a lovely time or enjoy important moments."

We can all find ways to enjoy life and support each other, even if we do things differently.

I might have felt a bit scared or confused at first, but then I'd understand why it was important.

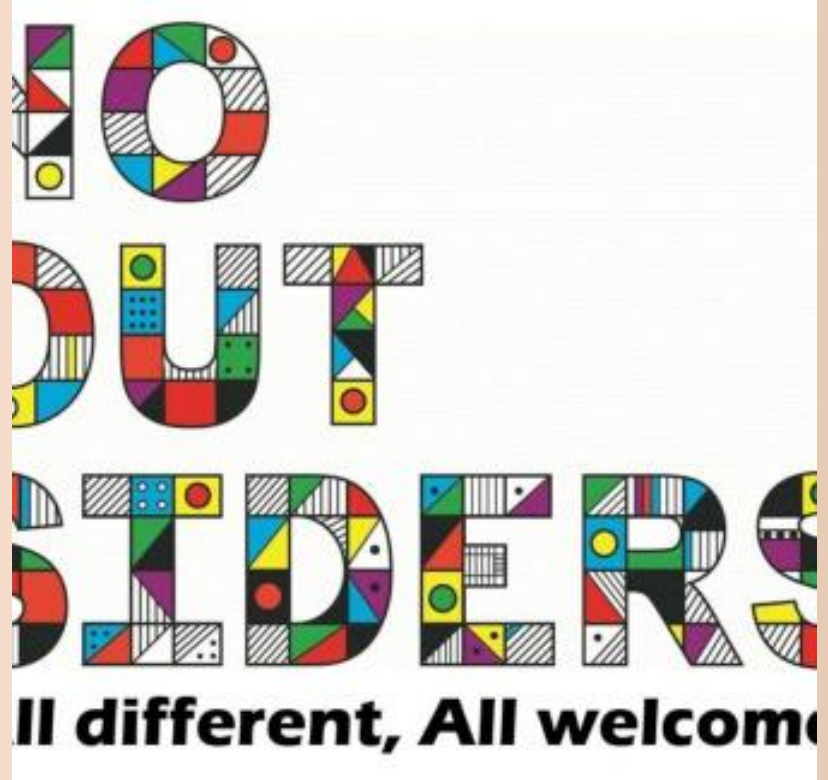
It helped them understand what it's like for Lucy every day, and how she experiences things.

Lucy is blind, which means she cannot see. She uses her other senses, like touch and hearing, to experience the world. We all have things that make us unique!



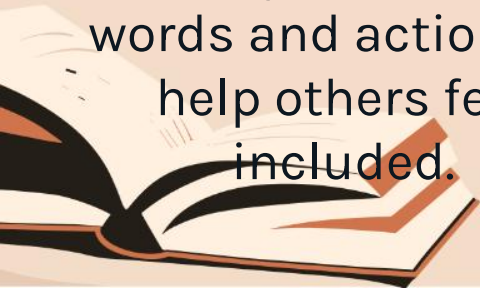
Ways to Support Each Other
