Our Identity

WHAT IS THE CENSUS?

Counting Everyone

The UK conducts a census every few years, counting everyone and gathering data like age, location, and ethnicity.

Why It Matters

This data helps the government plan schools, hospitals, and services for all communities.

Asian/Asian British: ~25%.

Black/Black British: ~10%.

WHAT IS INTEGRATION?

Living Together

Everyone Belongs

British Law
