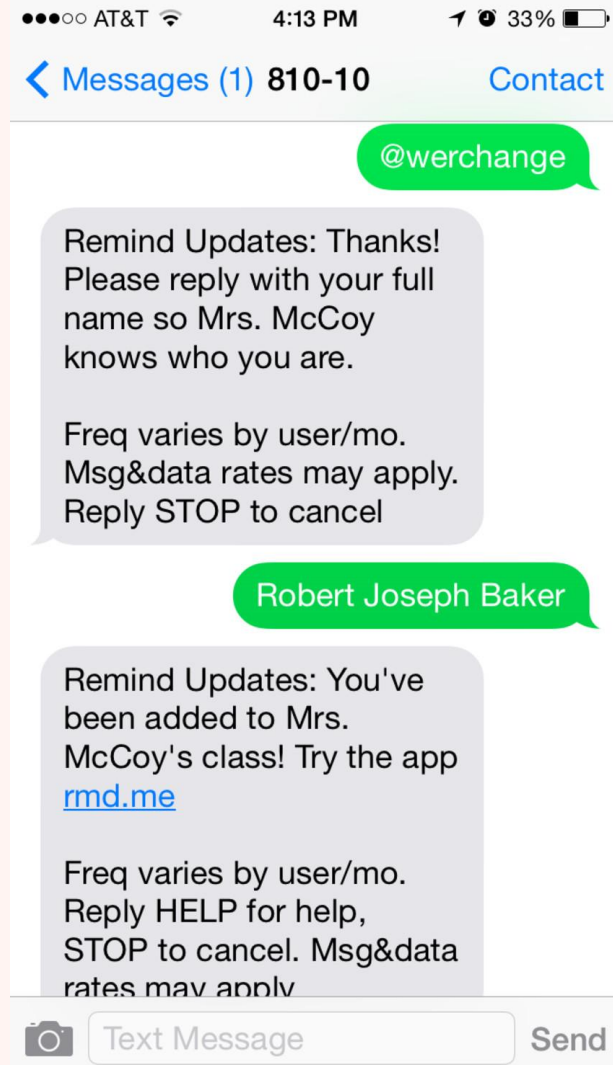
What do you see? What words or feelings come to mind?

A high school observed students using unkind words, both at school and home. This negativity created an unhappy environment, with students focusing on problems. Teacher Miss Leila McCoy worried her students were becoming "complainers," constantly highlighting the bad.

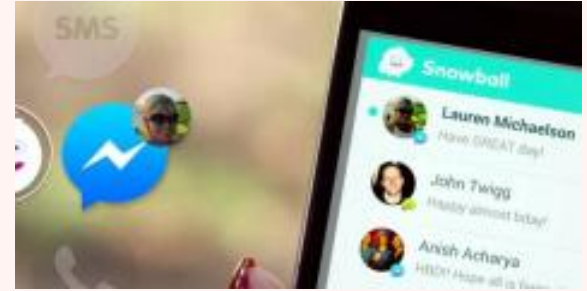
Miss McCoy wanted students to focus on kind, hopeful words.

Every Morning

Students sent kind messages like 'You're amazing!' and 'Believe in yourself!'

Shared by Name

Messages came via Miss McCoy's phone, but students wrote the kind words.

A SCHOOL TRANSFORMED

Big Changes

The group became a huge success; students looked forward to kind words daily.

The Class Motto

They chose: *'Be the change you want to see.'*

What Does This Mean?

Want kindness? Be kind. Your words can make a difference.



HOW IT WORKED



Join Up

Students signed up and promised to send only kind messages.

Send Daily

Each morning, students sent one positive message to share.

Stay Positive

No one sent unkind words—everyone respected the rules.

Quick posts can lead to negativity, spreading fast and hurting others.



Miss McCoy's Way

Her group, a beacon of positivity, showed social media's power to unite, not divide.

KINDNESS WITHOUT TECHNOLOGY

Do We Need Phones?

No! We don't need social media to spread kindness.

Real-Life Examples

A school in Birmingham, during Covid, slipped encouraging notes under classroom doors.

Simple messages like *'Have a nice day! Love from Year 3'* made others smile.



CREATIVE KINDNESS



Lower a Basket

One class lowered a basket from their window with a note for the class below.

Send a Note

Inside: *'Hello from Year 4! Have a great day!'*

Spread Joy

The surprise brought laughter and connection, even without seeing faces.
