




## **Weekly Attendance Figures**

# Did you know...

If your child finishes the year with **95% attendance** they will still have missed 10 school days, which equates to around **55 hours of learning time**?

In fact, if your child misses just one day in the week it equates to them missing 20%, with their weekly attendance sitting at just 80%.

Remember: every day counts!

## A bunch of budding Scientists!

We would like to thank The Royal Latin school for lending us some fantastic Science equipment over the year. Their outreach programme, financed by the Lillingstone Trust, supports local schools to deliver the Science curriculum by lending out high-quality STEM resources free of charge. Our children have really enjoyed using this equipment this year. We have conducted experiments to prove that yeast is a living organism. Using conical flasks and balloons, we added yeast, sugar and water to see if it would respire and inflate the balloon. We also used microscopes to observe various insects and feathers and produced some amazing scientific drawings. Finally, we have built circuits using electronics boards. This extended to a Design and Technology project where we built a buzzwire game. Our children have benefitted greatly from these resources and we are pleased to be continuing the partnership next year. A big thank you to Emma Ford for preparing the resources for us. It is really appreciated.

On Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> July we took some Year Six children to watch the Wimbledon Championships. We navigated the train and tube system and arrived at Murry Mount in time for lunch. After visiting the shop, we headed to Court 1. The children picked up the rules of tennis really quickly and were transfixed by the tennis ball! We were lucky enough to see Cameron Norrie undertake a 4 and half hour match! We had numerous comments on how well behaved the children were and how polite and respectful they were being during the matches. The thumbs up was the photo criteria of the day and everyone had a lovely time. As promised, the day was topped off by a visit from Dug the Bug on the train, which, for a while was the highlight of the day!









#### Art for sale at the Summer Fair!

**EYFS** have done some incredible work inspired by Henri Matisse!

In **Year 1**, we have designed artwork inspired by Pete Oswald's illustrations from the books 'The Bad Seed and 'The Good Egg'. We created a background using watercolours so our illustrations would stand out!

**Year 2** have been inspired by the work of Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama, known for her bold use of colour, patterns, and her signature polka dots. The children have explored her unique style and used it as a starting point to create their own imaginative artwork full of bright colours and pattern.

**Year 3** did some art work based on Diary of a Wimpy Kid. We watched some tutorials on how to draw in the style of the illustrator before using this knowledge to create our own version of the character. We put our versions onto a front cover to create our own stories.

As part of the Art Exhibition, **Year 4** explored the work of Damien Hirst, an artist known for incorporating real-life insects into his vibrant, collage-style artwork. The children studied his unique use of pattern and colour, then traced over insect images to create their own imaginative interpretations, using a variety of colours and shapes to form bold, eye-catching collages.

In **Year 5**, we focused on the 1980s. We learnt about the Berlin wall and why it was constructed after World War II. We focused on the French artist Thierry Noir, who lived in Berlin during the 80s. His art depicts human-like forms which use bold, bright colours and simple lines so he could be quick when painting the wall in order to evade the authorities. His art is seen as a protest against the wall.

In **Year 6**, we studied British artist David Hockney. We unpicked his paintings with a keen artist's eye, emulating some of his colours with pastels and acrylic and found out more about his life and background. We created double-page spreads, including some of our hand-drawn replicas, before we designed a final piece - that will be on sale at the Fair! Come along and browse our Hanslope gallery!

Over the last few weeks, Year 6 have been working on their own 'Enterprise' project in order to raise enough funds for part of our Leavers' Day activity.


