This is something that has not previously happened for a number of years.</li> <li>The new walking to school initiative is supporting healthy choices that can be made every day.</li> <li>Exciting visitors and events have raised the profile of sports and PE.</li> <li>School is now well equipped with high-quality sports equipment which is safely and secured stored centrally.</li> <li>School has access to large playing fields and a new MUGA for outdoor sports.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Attainment in swimming needs to raise – this has been hampered additionally by the pandemic.
