Miss Dunning and Mrs Laverick will continue to teach Computing and Music & French respectively across school. Miss Dunning will be going on maternity leave in September so will not be in school until later in 2025.

Mrs Newton and Mrs Allinson will work with pupils in Year 3 and 4 and Years 5 and 6 respectively through running our 'pods' for children who need some additional support to access their learning.

We will continue with a mixed Year 3 and 4 class in KS2, which has worked really well this year. Now we will also have one class which is a mixture of Year 5 and 6 children. This is because our pupil numbers in KS2 are not high enough for us to run separate classes. These year groups have worked together before so the children know each other well. They will also receive the same curriculum which ever class they are in: English and maths will be delivered at the child's year group level and all other subjects will continue to be taught on a two-year rolling programme so all children will receive the full curriculum over their time in Year 3 and 4 and then again in Years 5 and 6. Please come and see me if you have any questions about this.

I will write to you again in a few weeks with details of which class your child will be in. We will also be having a transition morning on Thursday 4th July where children will spend the day in their new classes. Further details will follow.
