



Spiritual

- MFL supports spiritual development by building upon their knowledge of, and respect for, different people's faiths, feelings and values. Children learn about and discuss the views of people in French speaking countries, and similarities/differences between their own views and values.
- MFL lessons provide opportunities to learn about others and the world around them. Children learn where in the world the French language is used, as well as finding out about specific places of importance, e.g. the Eiffel tower.

Moral

- MFL supports moral development by giving insight into different cultures and attitudes.

Social

- MFL encourages children to use a range of social skills in different contexts. Children must practise French speaking regularly, in small groups and during partner work. Children are also given opportunities to speak in front of the whole class, and provide constructive feedback to their peers.
- MFL supports social development by offering KS2 children a chance to attend French club after school. This develops willingness to participate in a variety of social settings and cooperating with others.

Cultural

- MFL supports cultural development by exposing children to another culture besides their own, and allows them to recognise and value the things we have in common across these different settings. Children discuss cuisine, traditions and celebrations of people living in France and can compare them to those of their own.
