

# Hardwick Green Primary Academy Relationships & Sex Education (RSE) Survey Response – 2020/21



We are pleased to report the results of our RSE curriculum consultation. Please see the overall summary, below, and the detailed results for each question.

#### Summary

We had eight respondents to our survey, which ran for two months. Information was posted on Class Dojo and the school websites, with a prize draw for one lucky winner, drawn at random, as an incentive for completion.

As can be seen below, the consultation was very positive. Parents and carers found that the curriculum offered was appropriate, and could not think of ways in which it could be improved. We will continue to listen to feedback, if and when it arises, and will consult if we make changes to the RSE curriculum.

#### Consultation results, by question:

#### How helpful do you find the RSE page of the website - with 1 being not helpful and 10 being very helpful?

Mean average of 8.88, with a range of 4 (6 being the lowest, 10 being the highest), a median of 9.5 and a mode of 10. This shows that, on balance, the RSE page of the website is useful for parents and carers.

#### Your child will have had their first RSE lessons just before their summer holidays. Did you feel that they were appropriate and/or useful?

The vast majoriy of respondents indicated that they believe their child's RSE lessons were appropriate and useful. Two respondents mentioned that their child didn't talk about the lessons. No one mentioned the lessons being inappropriate. Comments included:

- "I feel that the RSE lesson was very appropriate and very well delivered to my child, it was very age appropriate and my child understood very well about being safe."
- "Useful! As much as I didn't agree with it at first, think in reality it's best to understand it more at early age."

## Are there any topics we are covering in our RSE curriculum that you think we shouldn't be?

All respondents replied "no" to this question.

### Are there any topics we aren't covering in our RSE curriculum that you think we should be?

Again, all respondents replied "no". Comments included:

• "I feel like there is a broad and balanced cover of the essentials at the moment so there isn't anything missing that springs to mind."

### Is there anything else you'd like to add about our RSE curriculum?

Four comments were made comments made:

- "I think it's good bringing RSE into school for all ages every child should know what's healthy and what's not and the understanding in age groups."
- "I feel like it's well considered and thorough compared to what my child in another school gets."
- "I believe that the RSE curriculum is very appropriate. The topics that are covered are well explained and are helpful for our children to understand."
- "I trust the staff to have open and honest conversations at an age appropriate level."
