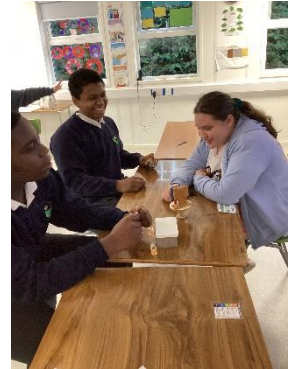


# Autumn Term

## Communication and interaction

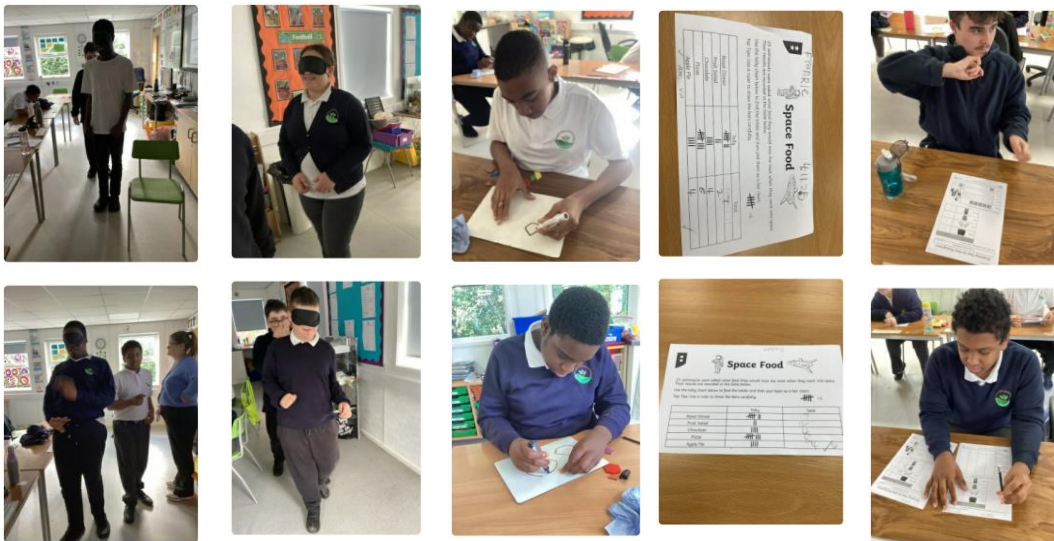
Our focus for Communication and Language this half-term has centred on the overarching theme of *My Feelings*. We read many books about emotions and wrote about how different situations make us feel. We also explored diary entries, their key features, and how we might structure them.

In SPAG, our focus has been on making our sentences more complex, whether through speaking or writing. We have also revisited capital letters, full stops, and finger spaces, and discussed when each should be used.



## Cognition and Learning

Our focuses for Cognition and Learning have included internet safety, the human body, number, shape, and statistics. In maths, we have been learning about numbers 1–100, place value, 2D and 3D shapes, and interpreting as well as creating tally charts. In Science, we have looked at the parts of the body, our organs, and our senses.



## Independence, social and emotional development

This term in Food Technology, we have been exploring new foods and discussing our individual likes and dislikes. Back in September, the children each selected a meal they either enjoyed or had never tried before, and we prepared these dishes weekly. Afterwards, we talked about the components they liked or disliked, as well as whether they enjoyed the dish as a whole. We have also taken walks within the community and practised safe road-crossing skills. In addition, we have played a range of games together in class to strengthen friendships and foster a positive class community spirit.



## Physical and Sensory

In PE this term, we have been developing both ball skills and basic gymnastics skills. We have practised dribbling and passing, and the children have taken part in several three- or four-a-side games. In gymnastics, we have focused on the body shapes required for different types of rolls, and we have also practised safely jumping from a height and landing on two feet.
