Dear Parents and Carers,




Curriculum in action: Reception

Children in Reception have continued to enjoy learning about sea creatures and ways we can help sustain and protect our environment from plastic pollution.

We have enjoyed reading stories using our reader voice, including expression and repeating phrases from the stories. We created polar bears using junk modelling and have been continuing to work hard in number, by adding using manipulatives and had a go writing addition sums to match. Great work children!


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Year 1 have been working hard in DT and have spent this term creating and improving a wheel mechanism. We developed our project by adding and improving our wheels by attaching a wooden dowel as an axle. We then designed a push and pull toy by using a paper cup to attach on top of our base. Great work year 1.

We have worked hard in Literacy to learn our story called "It's my Birthday". Children have practiced rehearsing the story and learning key extracted vocabulary, with the use of visual and pictorial aids to learn the words. Children have applied ambition vocabulary in their writing and have successfully written a narrative. Superb work Year 1.

We will keep up the hard work, in terms of applying our phonic knowledge and working on our individual writing targets, including presentation.

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Mathematics:




This week in Maths the children have been practicing multiplying and dividing. The whole class has excelled in their 2s and 5s.


Writing:

Our classroom has been full of fantastic learning this week! ✨





In Reading, they have impressed us with their thoughtful comparisons of characters and by writing their own sentences inspired by their ideas.


In Maths, we have been exploring length and perimeter, learning to measure and convert between metres, centimetres and millimetres with increasing accuracy and confidence.



There's lots more exciting learning approaching!





Why are oceans important? import export and trade.



Year 6 have had a brilliant week leading up to half term!


We've practised finding percentages of amounts and solving two-step problems in Maths.


The children have also completed their non-chronological reports and written them out in their best handwriting.

Spiritual thought for the week...


