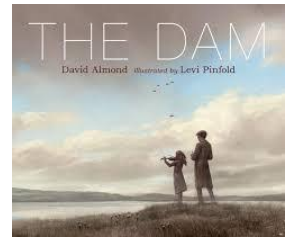


# The Dam

fiddle	A string instrument, similar to a violin.	To play with something (v)
dam	A wall or structure that is built across a river in order to stop the water flowing freely.	To dam a river (v)
valley	A low stretch of land between hills, especially one that has a river flowing through it.	
piccolo	A small musical instrument that is like a flute but produces higher notes.	
dawn	The time of day when light first appears in the sky, just before the sun rises.	I sat next to <b>D</b> awn (n)
shore	The shores or the shore of a sea, lake, or wide river is the land along the edge of it.	
fertile land	Healthy areas of land where crops and plants can grow easily.	Able to reproduce new life (a)
darkening	Where something or somewhere becomes darker or has less light.	
drowned	Where something or someone is covered in water and can no longer breathe or survive.	To drown something out (v)
nearby	When something is close to you or something else – a short distance away.	
artificial	Artificial objects, materials, or processes do not occur naturally, they are created by humans.	
homesteads	A homestead is a farmhouse, together with the land around it.	
folk music	Music that is passed on from generation to generation, usually originating in rural areas.	County folk (n)
