





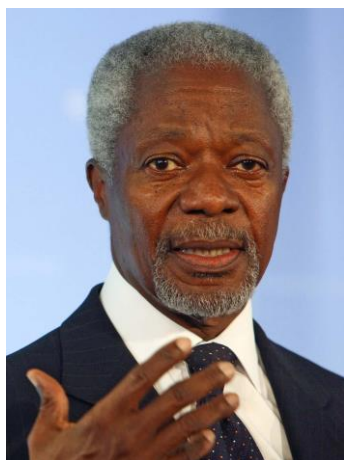


Continuous Urban Fabric: The most built-up urban areas, where at least 80% of the land surface is built on and up to 20% is gardens or small parks. 	Discontinuous Urban Fabric: Where 50% to 80% of the land surface is built on such as small villages and towns. 	Industrial and Commercial: Areas of lands that contains shopping centres, manufacturing and industrial estates. 
Types of Land Use		
Natural Land: Areas of natural geography untouched / changed by humans, containing; lakes, rivers, forests and moorland. 	Farmland and Agriculture: Land dedicated to work, farming, livestock, vineyards and orchards. Used for the production of food. 	Green Urban Areas: Areas of land used mainly for leisure activities such as golf courses, football fields and local parks.

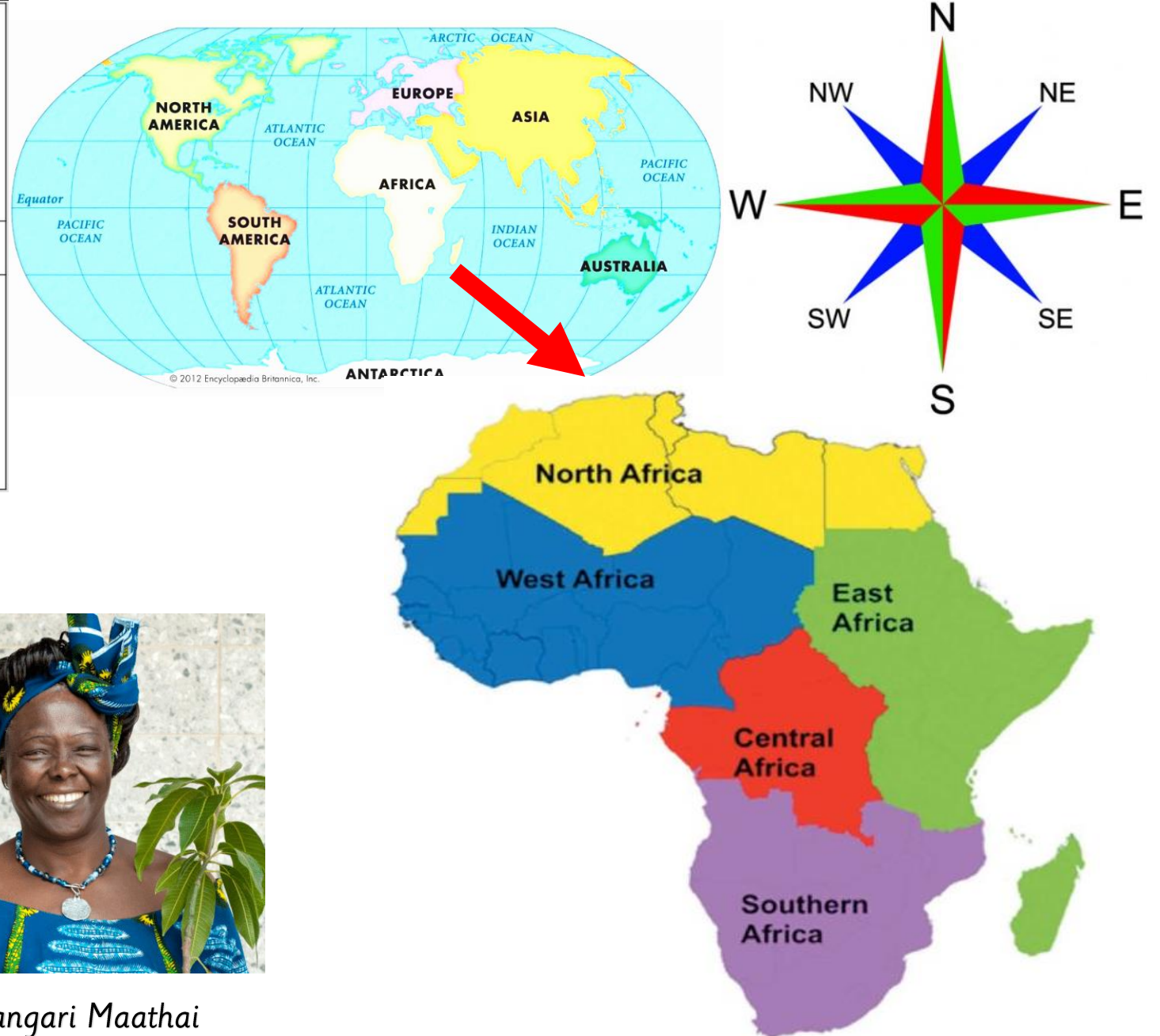

Vocabulary	Definition / Meaning
migration	The act of moving from one location to another voluntarily for positive reasons.
apartheid	Apartheid was a political system in South Africa in which people were divided into racial groups and kept apart by law.
civil rights	Civil rights are the rights that people have in a society to equal treatment and equal opportunities, whatever their race, sex, or religion.
explorer	An explorer is someone who travels to places about which very little is known, in order to discover what is there.
British Empire	The UK and countries around the world controlled by the British government.
primary source	Primary Sources are immediate, first-hand accounts of a topic, from people who had a direct connection with it.
secondary Source	Secondary Sources are one step removed from primary sources, though they often quote or otherwise use primary sources. They can cover the same topic, but add a layer of interpretation and analysis.
bias	Bias is a tendency to prefer one person or thing to another, and to favour that person or thing.
persecution	Persecution is cruel and unfair treatment of a person or group, especially because of their religious or political beliefs, or their race.
enslaved	To enslave someone means to make them into a slave.
slavery	Slavery is the system by which people are owned by other people as slaves.
misconceptions	A misconception is an idea that is not correct.
continent	A continent is a very large area of land, such as Africa or Asia, that consists of several countries.
country	A country is one of the political units which the world is divided into, covering a particular area of land.
equator	The equator is an imaginary line around the middle of the Earth at an equal distance from the North Pole and the South Pole.
