scale	If you refer to the scale of something, you are referring to its size or extent, especially when it is very big.	size	noun
bough	A bough is a large branch of a tree.	branch	noun
visitor	A visitor is someone who is visiting a person or place but does not stay.	guest	noun
pearl	A pearl is a hard round object, which is shiny and usually creamy-white in colour. Pearls grow inside the shell of an oyster and are used for making expensive jewellery.	rare stone	verb
loomed over	If something looms over you, it appears as a large or unclear shape, often in a frightening way.	leaned over	verb
civilised	Being or acting in a polite or well-mannered way.	polite	adjective
uncivilised	Being or acting in a rude or cruel way.	disgraceful	adjective
savage	Someone or something that is savage is extremely cruel, violent, and uncontrolled.	vicious	adjective
silhouette	A silhouette is a solid back shape or outline of an object – just like a shadow.	outline	noun
exchange	If you exchange something, you replace it with a different thing, especially something that is better or worth more.	trade	verb
laps	When water laps against something, it touches it gently and makes a soft sound.	ripples	verb
draped	If you drape a piece of cloth somewhere, you place it there so that it hangs down in a casual and graceful way.	hang	verb
