Christians believe that Jesus sacrificed himself for others.




## Prayer

A crown of thorns was put on Jesus' head. He had to carry his own large wooden cross up a hill. At the top of the hill, Jesus was nailed to the cross, with nails through his hands and feet. Jesus was left on the cross to die.



The Tomb

After Jesus died on the cross, he was taken down from the cross and laid in a tomb by his friends. They rolled a large stone in front of the entrance of the tomb.



On the third day after Jesus'

crucifixion, the stone of the tomb had been rolled away. His body was gone from the tomb and an angel told Mary Magdalene that Jesus had risen from the dead.
