Reception's Learning for Spring 2

Our focus text is **Yucky Worms** by Vivian French.

You can't be FRIENDS with an earthworm... You can't even tell WHICH end is which! Or CAN you? But there's more to these lowly creatures than meets the eye. With the help of this book, rich in a variety of narrative and non-fiction text, children are invited to find out where worms live, see how they move, and understand why gardeners consider them friends.

Throughout our exploration of this book, we will learn... We can use some of our waste to make new compost. Some creatures and insects from our garden also help it to grow and develop.

We will name and identify common minibeasts we find in our environment.

We will observe the lifecycle of a frog and butterfly. The children will develop their outside area to attract a variety of insects and creatures.

# Some vocabulary we will hear from the book/topic and begin to use.

Word	Synonyms/Meaning
Minibeast	A small insect such as a caterpillar, beetle or snail.
Lifecycle	Stages a living thing goes through during its life.
Compost	A way to recycle waste into a useful material.
Earth	Soil or dirt.
Decay	To rot or breakdown.

## **How You Can Support Your Child's Learning**

We have introduced reading books in class. The books are carefully matched to the grapheme/phonemes (letters and sounds) the children are secure in recognising. Once your child has read the book in class, it will be sent home for you to listen to your child read it. If children are not secure in recognising grapheme/phonemes, they are given wordless books and take part in targeted sessions to support them.

Please talk to your child about graphemes/phonemes they are learning. Can they find them in a book? Can they write them? Can they think of a word using the phoneme?

It is so important that you are reading at home with your child as much as possible. If you have any questions, please ask.



# **Tricky Words**

'Tricky words' sometimes have unusual spellings or do not following usual phonemic rules. Children are exposed to tricky words frequently whilst reading and therefore need to practice them. The following words are the tricky words we are learning this half term:

# **Little Wandle Phonics**

During our daily phonics, your child will practise their grapheme/phoneme correspondence and review our learning of Phase 2 and Phase 3. We will continue to practise reading and writing words during phonics and independently through play.

Home learning opportunity:

discuss ways you can help.

Ask your child to write labels, notes or lists to help with shopping. Can they hear the sounds in the word and write them?

Please support your child with their phonics at home by using their sound mat, reading book and writing practise.

### **Maths**

Number: We will continue to develop our subitising and counting skills and explore the composition of numbers within and beyond 5. They will begin to identify when two sets are equal or unequal and connect two equal groups to doubles.

We will begin to understand that two equal groups can be called a 'double' and connect this to finger patterns

- sort odd and even numbers according to their 'shape'
- continue to develop their understanding of the counting sequence and link cardinality and ordinality through the 'staircase' pattern
- order numbers and play track games
- join in with verbal counts beyond 20, hearing the repeated pattern within the counting numbers.

#### **Lending Library**


