Links to: History (changing society, technological advancements), English (intertextuality, inference, textual analysis, character analysis, speaking and listening), PHSE – societal changes 	<u>Movie Genres</u> Students will watch several clips from films belonging to different genres and analyse the codes and conventions of those genres. Codes and Conventions – Setting, Themes, Motifs, Props, Character Types, Plot, Locations, Tone, Sound Design, Mis-en-scene etc. Wk 5 – Action, Wk 6 – Comedy, Wk 7 – Sci-fi
