The children have worked to deepen their understanding of the true value of numbers by using Base 10 equipment and place value counters. They have explored mathematical concepts through the use of number lines,

developing their problem solving skills, and Base 10 to compare and contrast different amounts. Year 3 rose to the challenge, confidently applying their knowledge and transferring their skills to mental maths tasks.

In science, year 3 have been magnetic! They have been experimenting to discover what materials magnets are attracted too. Did you know that not all metals are magentic?




