What's happening

YEAR 4

What a half term it has been! Year 4 have been scientists and researching the water cycle. Discussing precipitation and what it means and how it encompasses not just rain but sleet, snow and hail as well. Through their discovery they have explored the story 'Walter the Waterdrop' and created some amazing storyboards. Did you know that you are drinking water that the dinosaurs drank millions of years ago – Year 4 know how this is possible!

In their food technology lessons, the children have been looking at processed food and how this process allows foods to stay fresher for longer. Some of these processes we have been using for years and some processes have changed and developed, and some have stayed just as they were, such as smoking or salting food.

The children have tried tasting different foods and then cooking it. They created a tasty chickpea curry and brought samples of their culinary creations home. It is a simple and cost-effective meal, and the children are hoping to cook this at home for their families as well.

In math's the focus has been multiplication and division. The children have been applying their skills to reasoning problems, where they really have been using their critical thinking. They have been challenged by being given the question and the answer and finding out how to get to the answer – tricky!

In addition to multiplication and division they have also been looking at length and perimeter. Through discussion and research finding out the perimeter of a 2D shape or even how they could measure the perimeter of Stanley Park.

As the half term comes to a close, class 4S have finished their time visiting Upbeat. Today 4S gave a brilliant performance to their families, showcasing all they have learned during their lessons at Upbeat. Their musicality shone through and the children really did appreciate the support they received from their families.

It was truly wonderful for them to perform to an audience not just their peers but of their loved ones, and proudly display their musical knowledge, skill and not forgetting their passion for the music.

4H cannot wait to start their visit to Upbeat every Friday, which will start after half term.
