The experience began with a lively vocal warm-up, after all, every great story deserves a strong start! The children then split into smaller groups to work more closely together. Some explored expressive movement, while others focused on facial expressions and characterisation. Each group used imagination and dialogue to bring their characters' thoughts and feelings to life.

Throughout the day, our pupils embodied the academy's core values, demonstrating creativity, collaboration, and enthusiasm. They truly loved the experience and are already looking forward to 'part two' of the project in February. In preparation for their next story telling adventure, year 5 have begun reading 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' by Onjali Rauf. It is a powerful tale that celebrates friendship, empathy and courage.
