Our Year 6 children have been busy working on an exciting prohject all about the history of the Blackpool Illuminations and their importance to our town. After all, if you think of Blackpool, you think of the Tower and the lights!

They created a timeline showing key moments in the history of the Illuminations and explored the amazing designs that have contributed to the displays over the years, from the classic tableaux designs to the sparkling 'string lights' that hang between the lamp posts.

The children also researched some of the famous *Switch On* events, and we were surprised by a few of the discoveries! Did you know that the legendary Grand National horse **Red Rum** once switched on the lights? We're sure there was some 'horsing around' as he hooved the switch! And even **Kermit the Frog** had the honour one year, though notably without *Miss Piggy*!

During their historical investigations, the children learned why the Illuminations were turned off during the Second World War to protect the country from bombardment by the Luftwaffe. The whole nation fell dark during those war years, and sadly, Blackpool was no different. Due to post-war austerity, the Illuminations didn't shine again until 1949.

The displays have certainly evolved since their first showing in 1879, when they were described as "artificial sunshine" and consisted of just eight carbon arc lamps. Today, the Illuminations feature spectacular additions such as the **Lightpool Festival**, interactive installations, and an extended season, continuing to bring light, colour, and joy to residents and visitors alike.

To go hand in hand with their learning the children have designed their own illuminations and creative 'Switch On' events. Linking their ideas to the past but embracing the future.
