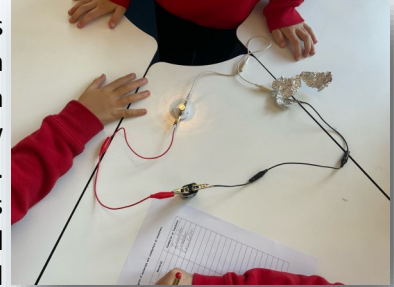

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about SHARING PHOTOS ONLINE

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

INVASIONS OF PRIVACY
 Even with the right settings, photos can be shared with anyone who has access to the device. If a child's phone is lost or stolen, anyone who finds it can see all the photos on it. Even if the photos are deleted, they can still be recovered by someone with the right equipment.

REVEALING PERSONAL DETAILS
 Photos can reveal personal information about a child, such as their name, address, and school. This information can be used by strangers to contact the child or their family.

MISUSE OF IMAGES
 Photos can be used to create a false identity for a child. This can be used to trick friends, family, or even strangers into believing that the child is someone they are not.

ONLINE GROOMING
 Photos can be used to lure a child into a conversation with a stranger. The stranger can then use the photos to build a relationship with the child and eventually groom them for sexual exploitation.

PRESSURE TO PLEASE
 Children can feel pressure to share photos of themselves or their friends to fit in with their peers. This can lead to them sharing photos that they are not comfortable with.

IMPACT ON DIGITAL FOOTPRINT
 Photos shared online can stay on the internet forever. This can create a digital footprint that can be used by employers or other people in the future.

Advice for Parents & Carers

REVIEW SETTINGS REGULARLY
 Check the privacy settings on all devices and social media accounts. Make sure that only trusted friends and family can see the photos.

CHECK YOUR PHOTOS
 Before sharing a photo, think about what it shows. Does it reveal any personal information? Is it appropriate for a public audience?

CONSIDER OTHER CHILDREN
 Think about how sharing a photo might affect other children. Could it make them feel uncomfortable or embarrassed?

THINK AHEAD
 Consider the long-term implications of sharing a photo. Will it still be relevant in a few years? Could it be used to harm the child in the future?
