## What's happening

### YEAR 3

In year 3, the children have been learning about what plants need to grow. Just like us, plants need food, water and the right environment to grow, bloom and thrive.

Our year 3 Nature Detectives have been investigating the fascinating idea that plants can also grow **without soil!** We often think that a sapling must have soil and nutrients to become healthy, but this isn't always the case. For example, orchids don't need soil at all; in nature, they attach themselves to the branches of trees. There are also *air plants* and *water plants* that use these resources to survive and thrive.

Year 3 have certainly learned a lot. Why not ask your year 3 child about how plants grow? You may be amazed at just how much they know!
