


Spring Term 2 2020 Year 2 Homework Grid

What materials would you use? What would your bug hotel include?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>SPAG</u></p> <p>In SPAG we are learning to use the conjunctions 'and', 'because' and 'or' to join two sentences together. Can you practice using these conjunctions both orally and written to extend your sentences?</p>

Can you explore your local garden or park and identify some mini-beasts?
