YOUR CHILD'S ANNUAL FLU VACCINATION 2022-2023 (LAIV NASAL SPRAY)

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. There may be a rebound in flu levels this coming winter following low levels in the past 2 years as a result of COVID-19 restrictions. The vaccination is free and is a quick, simple, painless spray up the nose.

- If your child has steroid tablets prescribed two weeks prior to vaccination.
- If in the few days prior to vaccination your child has been wheezy.
- If consent is received and you take your child to your GP surgery to receive the vaccination.

It is your responsibility to contact the school vaccination team to ensure they do not receive the immunisation again.

Harvest - StreetLife

A message from the Admin and Compliance Co-ordinator at Streetlife:

Streetlife's work continues to help vulnerable and homeless young people in Blackpool, Fylde and Wyre. Our Shelter provides nearly 3000 bed spaces with shower, laundry facilities, and food over the course of a year. We also provide drop in facilities during the daytime where young people can get information, support, and a hot meal, along with opportunities for life-skills, training, and fun activities.

Without the ongoing support of local schools and churches, we would simply be unable to provide the level of support that we do.

We would like to use the Harvest Appeal to raise awareness of how food poverty affect's young people in our town. Spending money on food often comes last, behind rent, bills and debt, leaving young people surviving on benefits with little to spend on nourishing food.

Help us by sorting items into food type

Where possible please sort these items into food types, e.g. beans, soups, vegetables. We ask that you don't send any decorative packaging as all donations will be broken down from original packaging, and re-sorted into standardised food parcels to be given out to young people, in supermarket shopping bags.

Items StreetLife would appreciate are:

<u>Food donations</u>: Tins of soup, tins of veg, tins of baked beans, tins of spaghetti, tinned meats, tins of fish, pasta sauce, tins of fruit, tins of rice pudding, jars of jam, tins/packets of custard, packs of dried pasta, rice and plain noodles, pasta in sauce, savoury rice packets, instant noodles, cup a soups, tea bags, biscuits.

<u>Toiletry donations</u>: Men's deodorant, Women's deodorant, shower gel, shampoo, conditioner, bars of soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, packs of tissues, razors, sponges and flannels, body lotion, sanitary towels, tampons, hair gel, aftershave balm, toiletry bag, combs and brushes, wet wipes, hairspray or mousse.

Men and women's new/unused underwear in adult sizes, small and medium.

Free School Breakfast Scheme – It is nine years since the Council introduced the universal free school breakfast (FSB) programme for primary school children, in response to concerns that many low-income families were struggling to adequately feed their children before school. We are taking an opportunity to review the programme, together with the holiday activity and food (HAF) programme. As part of the review, we would like to gather opinions on the current services provided, and obtain feedback on any suggested improvements from a range of stakeholders, such as teachers / parents + carers and pupils.

The survey is being conducted by Infusion Research on behalf of Public Health and should take no longer than 10 minutes to complete. All responses will be treated in the strictest confidence and any personal data collected will be for research purposes and shared only with relevant teams.
