<u>Sanitiser</u> – We have a stock of sanitiser that is over 70% alcohol and is fully available for pupils to use. We understand that due to allergies and specific reasons, there may be some cases where pupils may need to bring in their own. Please can this be over 70% alcohol and for individual use only - it should not be shared.

<u>Bags</u> – Thank you for all your support in helping us keep the academy as safe as we can. We have noticed recently that some children are starting to bring in bags from home. We will supply a clear plastic reading bag for reading books to go into so there is no need to be bringing in anything else except a coat, water bottle and packed lunch bag. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

<u>One-Way System</u> – Thank you for following our one-way system at the start and end of day. We appreciate some of our arrows have washed away and so once we get a dry spell we will remark the playground. I know it may be tempting to cut across but it's essential that we all follow the rules to keep safe. Many thanks.

<u>A Plea for Safer Parking</u> – Keep us all safe, please park safely! Please do park sensibly and safely when dropping off or collecting your children from school. Please do not park on the double yellow lines that are around all of our school entrances. We have concerns, our families have raised concerns and our neighbours have expressed concerns that a small number of people are not parking safely. If you can, please park away from school and walk in, this helps us to social distance and keeps us safe from coronavirus and also keeps the area around school traffic free and safer for your children. We never like to send children home from school, however, all your support during this time is very much appreciated.



Sleep Town

SleepTown is an app that helps your child attain a healthy, regular sleep schedule. The can construct amazing buildings just by achieving their bedtime and wake-up goals every day.



How it works: 3 steps to a healthy sleep schedule.

- 1. Set their own challenging bedtime and wake-up goal.
- Open the SleepTown app before bedtime goal and start constructing a building.
- 3. Wake up before their wake-up goal, shake your phone/tablet to clear your mind, and see which building they got. Every morning the building is a surprise that will motivate them to wake up!

Repeat these steps every day to maintain a regular sleep cycle and create a lovely "SleepTown"!

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS – SEPTEMBER 2021

PRIMARY APPLICATIONS

If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017, you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2021.

(Applications are required for all children with a 4th birthday between 1st September 2020 and 31st August 2021).

SECONDARY APPLICATIONS

If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6), you must apply for a Secondary School Year 7 place for September 2021.

(Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at a primary school).

Applications received after the closing dates will be processed after all those which are received on time. If you apply late this may reduce your chances of an offer for one of your preferred schools.
