<u>School Meals</u> – From 16<sup>th</sup> November we will be launching a new online school meal ordering system which will allow you to choose meal options with your child in advance.

Whilst at this stage lunches will still be taken in classrooms for safety reasons, after half term we will trial the addition of some hot sandwiches to the range currently offered.

We want to return to our usual service as soon as we can, please be assured that as soon as we feel we are able to offer meals in the dinner hall safely we will do so. This will be a phased return beginning with FS, Y1 and Y2.

<u>COVID testing during the holiday</u> – Please continue to follow the government guidance should your child have symptoms relating to COVID-19 during the half term holiday. #### **IMPORTANT WASH CARE INSTRUCTIONS**

Always refer to your garment care label to ensure that your uniform looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough, hardwearing uniform, however it is important that you follow the care labels correctly to ensure you get the best out of your purchase.

Turn garments inside out to wash and dry

- Fasten any buttons before washing
- Do not overload machine
- Iron inside out on a cool setting to avoid heat damage, which can cause a shiny surface on fabrics (do not iron knitwear or cuffs and welts on sweatshirts)
- Bobbling/Pilling is caused by friction and excessive heat. It is also known within the British textile industry that fabric softeners are a major cause of bobbling/pilling of the fabric. Bobbling/pilling often disappears over time and is not a reflection on the quality of the garment.

#### HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD

#### Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

- **CHEST:** Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing the tape close up under the arms.
- **COLLAR:** Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth
- WAIST: Measure around the natural waistline.
- **TROUSER LENGTH:** Measure the inside leg from crotch to floor without shoes on.
- **HIPS:** Measure around your hips, 20cm (8") below your natural waistline.
- SKIRT LENGTH: Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hem
- **DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH:** Measure from nape of neck to length required.

#### Sleep Town

SleepTown is an app that helps your child attain a healthy, regular sleep schedule. The can construct amazing buildings just by achieving their bedtime and wake-up goals every day.



How it works: 3 steps to a healthy sleep schedule.

- 1. Set their own challenging bedtime and wake-up goal.
- 2. Open the SleepTown app before bedtime goal and start constructing a building.
- 3. Wake up before their wake-up goal, shake your phone/tablet to clear your mind, and see which building they got. Every morning the building is a surprise that will motivate them to wake up!

# SCHOOL ADMISSIONS – SEPTEMBER 2021

### PRIMARY APPLICATIONS

If your child was born between **1st September 2016** and **31st August 2017**, you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2021. (Applications are required for all children with a 4th birthday between 1st September 2020 and 31st August 2021).

## SECONDARY APPLICATIONS

If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6), you must apply for a Secondary School Year 7 place for September 2021. (Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at a primary school).
