#### **PRIMARY APPLICATIONS**

If your child was born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015, you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2019. (Applications are required for all children with a 4th birthday between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019).

#### SECONDARY APPLICATIONS

If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6), you must apply for a Secondary School Year 7 place for September 2019.

(Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at a primary school).
