Dear Parents and Carers

As we go into our final week of the term, I would like to thank you for all your support over the past few months working with us to keep our community safe. As a staff, we are hugely grateful for this and for the kind words that many of you have taken the time to share with us. We will inform you next week of the arrangements we will be putting in place should there be a positive case identified within the academy once we have broken up.

I would like to bring to your attention information about the new curriculum for relationships and sex education (RSE) and health education. These subjects are designed to equip your child with the knowledge to make informed decisions about their wellbeing, health and relationships as well as preparing them for a successful adult life. Consultation at our school was delayed due to the COVID 19 pandemic. Initially the government requested that it was to be compulsory from September 2020 but, due to the disruption faced, the government has given all schools more time to ensure that this consultation takes place. As with all schools, we are required to consult with you when developing and renewing our policy. Our draft policy will be published on our school website and will be available to read early next week. We will invite you to express your opinion in order to help us decide how and when to cover the content of the statutory guidance. It may also help us decide whether to teach additional non-statutory content. All comments will be brought before the governing body for discussion. We will put a message on the academy app to notify you when this information is ready to read. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

<u>Christmas</u> – As noted last week please can we remind you that sadly, this year we are requesting that children do not bring Christmas cards into the academy from home as they usually would, instead, we will find a way in school to make sure that the children and staff are wished a happy Christmas in a safe, COVID secure way.

<u>School Meals</u> — After a fantastic start, we are sadly finding that online bookings for meals are not being made despite many attempts to support. <u>If your child has a school meal you will need to use this system to make their order</u> and, if you pay for meals, set up your preferred payment method. If you have not yet had the chance to login we would be grateful if you could do so as soon as possible. Or, if you are having problems please do get in touch with us so that we can help.

The system is easy to use and once you are in you can order meals in advance to the end of the term.

Our Christmas lunch is on Wednesday 16^{th} December and we invite parents to opt in for a meal on this day without the usual notice period. The cost of the meal is £2.20 (free to FS, Y1 and Y2 and those who are eligible for FSM) – see the menu below.

<u>Late Arrivals</u> – Please note if your child arrives after 9:15am and usually has a school dinner but you haven't ordered it on-line, then unfortunately with our new system a lunch cannot be ordered, therefore, you will need to supply them with a packed lunch.

IMPORTANT WASH CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Always refer to your garment care label to ensure that your uniform looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough, hardwearing uniform; however it is important that you follow the care labels correctly to ensure you get the best out of your purchase.

Turn garments inside out to wash and dry

- Fasten any buttons before washing
- Do not overload machine
- Iron inside out on a cool setting to avoid heat damage, which can cause a shiny surface on fabrics (do not iron knitwear or cuffs and welts on sweatshirts)
- Bobbling/Pilling is caused by friction and excessive heat. It is also known within the British textile
 industry that fabric softeners are a major cause of bobbling/pilling of the fabric. Bobbling/pilling
 often disappears over time and is not a reflection on the quality of the garment.

HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD

Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

- CHEST: Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing the tape close up under the arms.
- **COLLAR:** Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth
- WAIST: Measure around the natural waistline.
- TROUSER LENGTH: Measure the inside leg from crotch to floor without shoes on.
- HIPS: Measure around your hips, 20cm (8") below your natural waistline.
- SKIRT LENGTH: Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hem
- DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH: Measure from nape of neck to length required.

The Big Story Challenges


A new competition for deaf children and young people who love writing and drawing.

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS – SEPTEMBER 2021

PRIMARY APPLICATIONS

If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017, you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2021.

(Applications are required for all children with a 4th birthday between 1st September 2020 and 31st August 2021).

SECONDARY APPLICATIONS

If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6), you must apply for a Secondary School Year 7 place for September 2021. (Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at a primary school).
