

<u>Year 2 Nativity Performances</u> - As you may be aware, your child has been rehearsing for their class Nativity performance. Performance dates are as follows: Class 2H - Monday 13<sup>th</sup> December 2:45pm-3:15pm. Class 2S - Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> December 2:45pm-3:15pm and Class 2A - Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2:45pm-3:15pm.

On the day of your child's performance please send your child into school with a black top and black pants in a plastic bag with their name on. If your child is an angel please bring a white top and light-coloured tights instead. This is to be changed into and worn under their costume.

#### School Admissions – September 2022

<u>Primary Applications</u> – If your child was born between **1st September 2017** and **31st August 2018**, you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2022. (Applications are required for all children with a 4<sup>th</sup> birthday between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2022). Closing date for applications – **15<sup>th</sup> January 2022.** 

<u>Secondary Applications</u> – If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6), you must apply for a Secondary School Year 7 place for September 2022. (Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at a primary school). Closing date for applications – 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021.

If you live in Blackpool (pay council tax to Blackpool) you need to apply for a school place on-line at: <u>www.blackpool.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u>.

If you pay your council tax to Wyre or Fylde then you will need to access Lancashire's on-line application system at www.lancashire.gov.uk You can still express preferences for Blackpool schools on Lancashire's application system. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE IT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE!
