**Hawes Side Academy App** - If you haven't already done so, we would like to recommend that all parents and carers download our Hawes Side Academy App. This can be downloaded on both apple and android devices and is a great way to keep up to date with everything going on at school.

**IMPORTANT WASH CARE INSTRUCTIONS**

Always refer to your garment care label to ensure that your uniform looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough, hardwearing uniform, however it is important that you follow the care labels correctly to ensure you get the best out of your purchase.

Turn garments inside out to wash and dry

- Fasten any buttons before washing
- Do not overload machine
  
- Iron inside out on a cool setting to avoid heat damage, which can cause a shiny surface on fabrics (do not iron knitwear or cuffs and welts on sweatshirts)
- Bobbling/Pilling is caused by friction and excessive heat. It is also known within the British textile industry that fabric softeners are a major cause of bobbling/pilling of the fabric. Bobbling/pilling often disappears over time and is not a reflection on the quality of the garment.

**HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD**

Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

- **CHEST:** Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing the tape close up under the arms.
- **COLLAR:** Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth
- **WAIST:** Measure around the natural waistline.
- **TROUSER LENGTH:** Measure the inside leg from crotch to floor without shoes on.
- **HIPS:** Measure around your hips, 20cm (8") below your natural waistline.
- **SKIRT LENGTH:** Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hem
- **DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH:** Measure from nape of neck to length required.

**Arrival to and departure from school** - Only one parent/carer is asked to accompany/collect pupils to/from school and parents/carers are asked not to loiter on the school grounds. In/out access points and a one way system (see map below) will be employed to support a steady flow of traffic. When on school grounds we ask that you follow social distancing guidelines. The systems for drop off and collection are in place to limit mixing and spread of the virus, we ask parents/carers to please drop off and collect children on time. All arrangements will be reviewed regularly and may be altered according to need and latest guidance. Staff will be supporting you in the safe and smooth arrival and collection of pupils.

**Arrival** - We will welcome pupils into the academy in 2 time slots.

- **Time slot 1 (8.40 – 8.50 a.m.) will be for pupils and their siblings** (this also includes a families working as a support bubble)
- **Time slot 2 (8.50 – 9.00 a.m.) will be for children without siblings at Hawes Side Academy.**

In order to maximise the use of all gates we ask parents to use the gate nearest their pupil entrance point (see map) wherever possible i.e.

- **Foundation Stage: Johnsville Avenue**
- **Year 2 and Year 3: Lennox Gate**
- **Year 1 and Year 4: Johnsville Avenue**
- **Year 5 and Year 6: Pedders Lane**

**Time slot 1 (8.40-8.50am) - Siblings. (Arrival)**

Parents/carers of all pupils who have siblings will enter the playground using their favoured gate and drop off their children at their allocated entrance points using the one-way system (see map below)

**Time slot 2 (8.50-9.00am) - Non-Siblings. (Arrival)**

Parents/carers of all pupils who do not have siblings at Hawes Side Academy will enter the playground using their favoured gate and drop off their child at their allocated entrance point using the one-way system (see map below)

**Departing** - We will dismiss pupils from the academy in 2 time slots.

- **Time slot 1 (3.00 – 3.10 p.m.) will be for FS, Y1, Y2 pupils and their siblings** from across the school
- **Time slot 2 (3.10 – 3.20 p.m.) will be for remaining pupils in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6.**

**Time slot 1 (3.00 – 3.10pm) - FS, Y1 and Y2 pupils and their siblings.**

Parents/carers of FS, Y1 and Y2 pupils and their siblings will enter the playground using their favoured gate and pick up pupils at their entrance point using the one-way system (see map below).

**Time slot 2 (3.10 – 3.20pm) - Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6**

Parents of Y3-Y6 pupils will enter the playground using their favoured gate and pick up pupils at their entrance point using the one-way system (see map overleaf)

**One-Way-System** - We would appreciate your continued co-operation in following our one-way-system. Please see diagram below.



**Guidance for returning to school** - Following the recent Government announcements please read the information below:

**Frequently asked questions:**

**1. Return to school 8th March 2021**

Hawes Side Academy will reopen as normal on Monday 8th March. As always, we will ensure our ways of working follow the government guidance to support safe working. The systems we have in place for arrival and departure remain and we ask that you continue to support as you have been doing by following the one-way system and maintaining your distance from others. Please can we ask that only one adult accompany children to school to reduce the number of people on site at the designated time. We also ask that adults do not stay on site any longer than you need to.

**2. Systems to stay safe**

We will continue to operate our enhanced regimes to support safety.

Use of Masks - There is no requirement for children or adults to wear masks in school. However, we will be asking that, in line with latest guidance and our Risk Assessment, some staff do so due to the work they are undertaking. Whilst not compulsory for children we will support parental decisions in relation to this.

Social distancing - We will continue to operate in bubbles maintaining as much distance as is possible and limiting the use of shared items. Lunch will continue to be taken in class.

Cleanliness - We will continue our enhanced cleaning regimes and are well stocked with soap and sanitiser to ensure pupils can continue to keep their hands clean.

## **Guidance for returning to school** - Continued

**Respiratory Hygiene** - Children will continue to be encouraged to follow the catch it, bin it, kill it approach

**Uniform** - please continue to send your children in full uniform with extra layers to keep warm where windows are kept open. We also ask that pupils do not bring in large bags and additional items that are not necessary in school.

**Ventilation** - rooms will be well ventilated throughout the day.

### **3. Mass Testing**

At this stage we have not been advised that we will be expected to carry out mass testing in our school. We will of course keep you informed should this requirement change.

### **4. Isolation and testing**

Whilst we are in national lockdown it is more important than ever that the guidance with regard to isolation and testing is followed.

Please can you ensure that:

- If your child displays symptoms they remain at home until a test has been carried out. Please keep us informed if a test result is positive so that we can act quickly.
- If your child has been in contact with someone who has symptoms or who has tested positive they must stay at home and self-isolate.
- Government guidance is followed in relation to travel abroad.

We will continue to be vigilant in school in letting you know of the onset of any symptoms during the school day.

### **5. Bubble closure/online learning**

Many of you may be worried about the prospect of school closure and the impact upon learning. Whilst it is not expected that we will close fully the probability of bubble closures remains high. In either case, please be reassured that we have undertaken a lot of work to develop our remote learning offer, which has been very well received by families who have already experienced bubble closure.

### **6. Out of School Clubs**

The current guidance allows us to continue running our out of school clubs (Breakfast and After School Club). As such, the offer will remain the same as in the Autumn Term.

Thank you for helping us keep our community safe, we look forward to seeing you on the 8th March 2021.

As an academy we are continuing to monitor the advice provided by the Government regarding Coronavirus on a daily basis and are implementing action as required e.g. enhanced cleaning regimes, opportunities for hand washing, access to sanitiser etc.

**Letter received from the Assistant Director of Children's Services (School Improvement & Special Educational Needs)**

Dear Parents/Carers

I'm sure most of you will have seen or heard about the government announcement for schools to fully reopen on the 8th March. Whilst I'm sure this is welcomed news for some there will be some of you who are anxious about your child returning to school.

The past 12 months have been tough for all of us, the demands of this pandemic have also brought out the very best in a great many people and I'm particularly in awe of the way you as parents, carers and guardians of children have risen to the unique challenges with which you have been faced.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the teachers and support staff in our schools for their engaging and supportive teaching. They really have gone over and above every day to ensure children receive the best education they can.

I want to reassure you about the measures the Local Authority and Schools have taken to ensure your children can be safe. Schools are reviewing their covid Risk Assessments and ensuring, as much as possible, that pupils can remain in their bubbles. Staff in all our primary schools are being tested twice a week and they will continue to follow public health advice.

It is vital your child attends school to minimise, as far as possible, the longer-term impact of the pandemic on their education, wellbeing and wider development. The usual rules on school attendance will apply from the 8th March including:

- Parents' duty to secure their child's regular attendance at school (where the child is a registered pupil at school, and they are of compulsory school age)
- The ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with local authorities' codes of conduct

Pupils who are self-isolating because they are following public health advice should not attend school. Those pupils who are clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV) are also currently advised not to attend whilst shielding remains in place. Any pupils or students not attending their setting should receive remote education.

Thank you for taking the time to read the letter and if you require any further help or advice about your child's return please contact their school directly.
