<u>Foundation Stage and Year 6 - Heights and Weights</u> - Parents of our Foundation Stage and Year 6 children received a letter regarding our school nurses coming into school to carry out heights and weights of our Foundation Stage and Year 6 children. I would like to confirm that they will be in school to carry this out on **Monday 19**th **April 2021**.

Year 1 - NHS Vision screening

Vision screening is an integral part of the universal delivery of the national Healthy Child Programme, and meets the criteria laid down by the National Screening Committee, which recommends that all children should be screened for visual impairment between four and five years of age.

Visual acuity, eye alignment and binocular vision continually develop from birth up to the age of seven. This is why it is important to test, detect early and begin any treatment of defects that may occur. The test also reduces the risk of defects developing into visual impairments if left untreated.

Children in Year 1 been invited to take part in this programme at school. The test will be carried out by staff from Blackpool Teaching Hospitals Orthoptic Department during normal school hours. This is a non-invasive test that should take no longer than a few minutes. To be able to

screen the orthoptist will need to access the name, date of birth and contact details of your child from the school. This will enable us to send a letter to you, usually within two weeks of the initial visit, to inform you of your child's results. Please be aware that this information will only be used by the vision screening service and any sharing is done under appropriate legal gateways. More information regarding the vision screening is at the end of this newsletter.

If you <u>DO NOT</u> want your child to take part, please ask your child's class teacher for a form which needs to be completed and returned to school before <u>Tuesday 13th April</u>. If you are happy for your child to be tested you do not need to do anything.

Vision Screening – Year 1

What is vision screening?

The aim of the eye test is to detect significantly reduced vision or the presence of a squint. Young children rarely complain about having reduced vision. If only one eye is affected it is even less likely to be noticed by the child, parents or teachers. The tests are carried out in school by Orthoptists from Blackpool Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. As NHS staff they are all DBS checked (Disclosure and Barring Service).

What does the screening test involve?

The vision will be tested of each eye using a letter test. Your child does not need to know their letters to be able to complete the test; the test can be a letter matching test. Each eye will be tested separately using glasses with one blacked out lens or an eye patch. We will then ask your child to name or match letters on a card held 3 metres away. The test is entirely safe and children enjoy playing the letter matching game.

We will also perform some simple tests to detect the presence of a squint. It takes approximately five minutes and the screener is trained to make this fun for the child.

Possible Results

If your child passes you will receive a letter informing you of the result. This means that at the moment their vision in both eyes is as expected for their age. This result does not rule out potential future eye problems. Children's eyes change as they grow so if you have any concerns about your child's eyes at any stage in the future, contact your local optometrist (optician) or GP.

If your child does not pass, you will receive a letter informing you of the result. Your child will be referred to the orthoptic department in Blackpool and you will receive a letter in the next few weeks from for hospital inviting vou to an appointment further It is important to attend the appointment for further tests to confirm your child's results and if treatment is required. Reduced vision may be caused by the child needing glasses or a turn in the eye (squint). Glasses and/or eye patches may be recommended as treatment for these problems. These tests could be carried out by an Orthoptist, who manage visual disorders related to eye development or misalignment, an Optometrist who can prescribe glasses if required, or an Ophthalmologist, depending on the results of the screening.

Sometimes a child does not pass the screening because they are tired or not able to concentrate on the day of screening. If the orthoptist feels this may be the case on the day, your child will be invited to Whitegate Drive Health Centre for a recheck.



If your child is absent on the day of screening, you will be invited to attend at Whitegate Drive Health Centre for a screening check. This appointment will be sent to your home address.

Does my child have to be screened?

No. We strongly recommend that your child is screened for vision defects; however you have the right to decline the assessment. No screening will take place without your consent. A letter will be sent home with your child informing you about the screening; this is an Opt-out letter and only needs to be returned if you do not wish for your child to be tested. If you do not receive a letter please ring the school for a copy.

How is my child's information used?

The school will share your child's name and date of birth with Blackpool Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. If you opt-out, they will not do anything further with this information. If your child is absent on the day of screening or does not pass the vision screening test, the school will also share your contact details so that we can contact you or make appropriate referrals into the hospital eye service. All results are stored securely at Blackpool Victoria Hospital.
