- Tuesday 28th February 2023
- Wednesday 15th March 2023
- Thursday 16th March 2023

As last time, the information we have at this point, indicates that the academy will open as usual on Tuesday 28th February 2023 to all pupils. Should there be any significant change then I will communicate this to you.

It is important to note that the strike is happening because of a national dispute between unions and the government regarding teachers' pay and not because of any issues related specifically to our academy.


