Parents Forum:

The Parents Forum are working hard to create a core following of active parents who engage with their own group, with the Local Offer Consultation Group and co-production work with Blackpool Council. As you may already be aware, Blackpool Council take great pride in working with and listening to parents. Short Breaks update:

As many of you know, the Short Breaks Package that is offered by Blackpool Council, underwent a significant review last year. Thanks to your feedback and involvement, the following information summarises our revised short breaks package below:

Holiday and weekend clubs for children and young people with complex needs

PIP have been awarded the contract to deliver this provision. They will be delivering holiday club provision to children and young people aged between 4 and 18 throughout all school holidays (summer, October, Christmas, February, Easter and May). Access to this provision will only be possible via a referral from a social worker and the child must meet one or more of the following criteria:

A severe or profound learning disability

A severe physical disability.

A substantial degree of visual impairment/moderate and severe hearing loss.

A complex Autistic Spectrum Condition with a learning difficulty.

A complex medical health condition, including: Cancer, Multiple Sclerosis, HIV/AIDS or severe disfigurement

Integrated Holiday and Weekend Clubs for children with mild/moderate SEND

Leisure Services have been awarded the contract to deliver this provision. They will be delivering holiday clubs throughout the summer, October, Christmas, February, Easter and May school holidays to children aged between 4 and 18. There will be a wide variety of activities available. The clubs will be open to all children in Blackpool, whether they have SEND or not. The clubs will be run inclusively so that all children, no matter what physical, emotional or learning difficulties they may have, will be able to fully engage with the activities. A timetable of the sessions will be released soon – watch out for more information on Facebook and the Local Offer website.

Annual Reviews for Phase Transfers

We are asking all our schools to organise Year 6 annual reviews in September, October and November 2021. This is to allow the SEND Assessment Team plenty of time to ensure that your children with an EHC plan to have a confirmed place at the secondary school that they wish to attend in September 2022.

We are asking all our schools to organise Year 11 annual reviews in November and December 2021 and January 2022, to ensure that your children with an EHC plan who are moving to college in September 2022 have a confirmed place.

Thank you in advance for your help and support in arranging these meeting within these time frames. Please prepare in advance for your annual review and ensure that any new information that school or the SEND Assessment Team need to be aware of is communicated to your School Senco.

SEN Funding Consultation

We are shortly sending out a consultation to schools and stakeholders on how we fund SEN Provision in Blackpool. More details will follow so please keep an eye out for the consultation and we would welcome as many responses as possible to the survey. The survey and consultation will be published on the council website and will be sent to schools.

SEND Strategy

The council are working towards refreshing the SEN Strategy for the area and will publish a new strategy by September 2021. We will be including parent focus groups in the process and will require help from our representatives on the Local Offer consultation group as described below.
