- Go to BBC Children in Need homepage (bbc.co.uk/cin) where you'll find links to information on The Royally Big Portrait, as well as instructions to 'Upload Here' to upload your child's drawing through our easy to use webform
- Portrait artist Sam Barnett will email you a link to the digital portrait when it has been created so you can see your child's work in The Royally Big Portrait
- You can then share this link with family and friends to celebrate your child's creativity and the historic Coronation of King Charles III
