Dear Parent/Guardian,

To celebrate King Charles III's Coronation, your child's school has decided to take part in the BBC Children in Need Royally Big Portrait.

Each child's picture will then be combined to create one giant virtual portrait of King Charles III. The final piece will be placed on public display both online and at various exhibition spaces.

For your child to be part of this historic moment and for their artwork to be included in The Royally Big Portrait, all you have to do is upload their drawing online, which is quick and easy to do:

1. **Snap a photo of your child's portrait of King Charles III on their BBC Children in Need's Royally Big Portrait worksheet.** Try to ensure the paper is as flat and non-creased as possible.
2. **Go to BBC Children in Need homepage (bbc.co.uk/cin) where you'll find links to information on The Royally Big Portrait, as well as instructions to 'Upload Here' to upload your child's drawing through our easy to use webform**
3. **Portrait artist Sam Barnett will email you a link to the digital portrait when it has been created so you can see your child's work in The Royally Big Portrait**
4. **You can then share this link with family and friends to celebrate your child's creativity and the historic Coronation of King Charles III**
