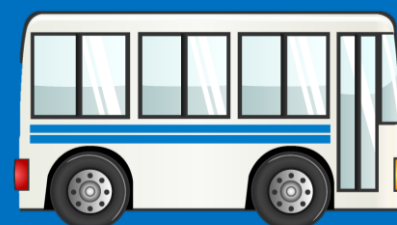
It was a Friday thriller last week when our Year 5/6 girls won against Anchorsholme on penalties.
