In the second half term we have been focusing on Heroes! We have looked at the books Supertato and Real Superheroes. Then thought about people who help us, where they work and when they help us. Now we are thinking about Christmas and are all very excited.















WILLOW CLASS



WOW!!! What a start to the year!! Hopefully you have been keeping updated on our daily 'Willow News' in your child's communication book and you have been able to follow us on Twitter to see the amazing things our children have been doing.

The children have blown us away with how incredible they have been on their return to school, engaging, focussing and loving life back at Hawthorns! They really have made us immensely proud and have been a credit to yourselves.

In Literacy, the children have worked very hard on their guided reading and phonic recognition. The children have worked to answer comprehension questions from texts and pictures. This has helped the children develop their vocabulary, use of descriptive words and their understanding. They've used our 'Say it, Make it, Write it' activities to segment, blend and write words and we have really focussed on our handwriting formation.

In Numeracy we have been working on our Number recognition, making groups to specific numbers, using addition sums, ordering numerals and developing quantity to number awareness.

















We have been working on developing the children's confidence, self esteem, interaction and independence through a variety of tasks and activities. We have learnt about our topic 'Under The Sea' and developed our knowledge about different sea creatures. We have worked independently and in small groups in cooking with Mrs Whittaker to develop our everyday life skills. The children were really engaged in their development and understanding of emotions, recognising emotion and learning to self-regulate their emotions, we've been doing amazing work with Miss McCormick in PE to keep us fit and healthy. The children have loved outdoor learning and forest school with Mrs Cottrell, as well as our Story massage with Mrs Adderley. We've had Halloween, Diwali, Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day, Birthdays..... It's no wonder we are all shattered, yet the children return everyday, smiles on their faces ready to make us all proud, they are an incredible group that we are lucky to spend each day with. We hope everybody has a lovely Christmas and a Happy New year. We look forward to seeing everybody again in January.


CHERRY CLASS
