


RED NOSE DAY

ASH CLASS

In Spring 1 Half Term we were providing a mixture of home learning and face to face learning. For the children in school accessing face to face learning we provided our usual learning offer of continuous provision, alongside cookery, PE, outdoor learning and star blazer clubs. For the children who were learning from home we provided 2 weekly emails, daily tweets, regularly updated website full of ideas and recorded videos of Miss Green and Mrs Shaw taking the register and doing Magic Box.

At the start of lock down we provided home learning packs for all the children who were learning from home, these included; magnetic letters and numbers, playdough, whiteboard and pen, pencil crayons, sharpener, pipe cleaners, colouring book, crayons, pom poms, tweezers, link cubes, glue stick, lollipop sticks and more activity ideas linked to the objects provided and worksheets (where appropriate). The children could also have their iPads at home (if their parents wanted them to).

In Spring 2 Half Term we have welcomed back all the children to Ash Class! We also welcomed three new faces, Nathan, Charlie and Macie. The children have settled back into school really well and it is like they have never been away. We were able to enjoy World Book Day twice which was brilliant! Over lockdown Mr McCarthy built us a fantastic loose parts play shed in our outdoor area and we are able to attach swings and hammocks to it. We have really been making the most of the sunshine and doing lots of learning outdoors!

It has been fantastic having all the children back and we look forward to what the rest of the year will bring!


















OAK CLASS




BEECH CLASS

WILLOW CLASS




Well I think it's safe to say it's been a rather strange term. The adults and children in school have hugely missed those who are home learning. We hope we're able to see everybody back as soon as possible!

Our topic this term has been all about 'Dinosaurs' — one day after lunch we came back into class to find all our chairs had been upturned and the class left in a complete mess!



SYCAMORE CLASS

CHERRY CLASS














Elder Class parents excelled at implementing home learning during lockdown. It was wonderful to receive so many videos and images of our students working extremely hard.

This term Blossom have started a new topic of 'Marvellous minibeasts'.


We have been finding out about lots of different minibeasts and their habitats! We created our own minibeast terrariums and are loving watching them grow!
