Bronze Age to Iron Age!

Overview Of Learning


The Bronze Age was a period when people learned to make tools and weapons from bronze, a mixture of copper and tin, which allowed for better farming and more advanced weapons, leading to the development of larger settlements and increased conflict; the Iron Age followed, where people discovered how to work with iron, a stronger metal than bronze, resulting in even better tools, more complex societies, and often defensive hillforts built by tribes to protect their land and possessions.
