behaves like.

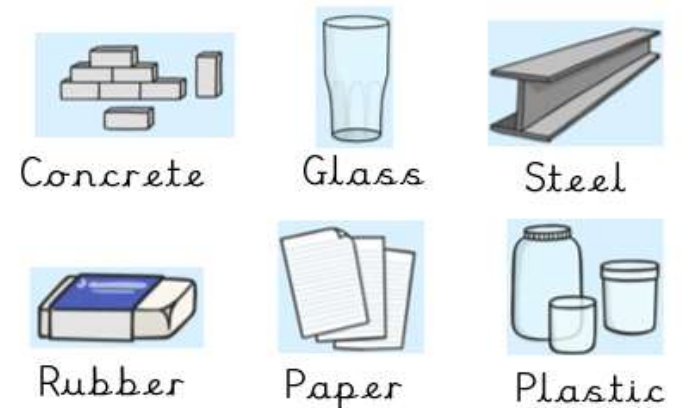
Soft	Easy to mould, press, cut or fold.
Smooth	No roughness, lumps or bumps - an even surface.
Rough	Uneven to touch and not smooth.
Bendy	Can be bent - soft or flexible.
Stiff	Does not bend or stretch easily.
Shiny	Smooth and reflecting light.
Dull	Doesn't reflect light.
Waterproof	Does not let water in or through it.
Absorbent	Can soak up water.

Comparing then and now



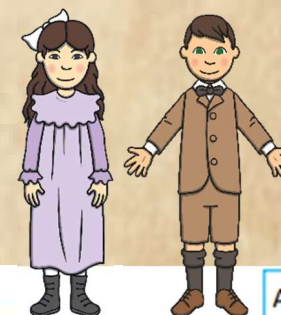
In a Victorian classroom, children sat at desks. In our classroom, we sit in groups.



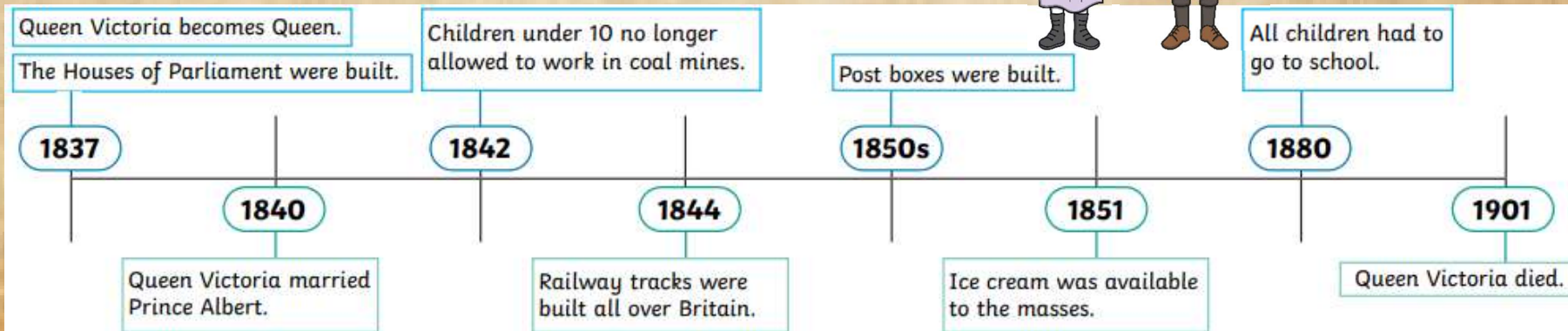
In Victorian classrooms, children used to write with chalk and slate. We use paper, pencils and sometimes computers.
