

### Head's Message:



# SCHOOL UNIFORM

Please can I remind everyone about our school uniform policy. I've noticed several items of clothing in school recently that are not on our uniform list. The correct uniform is important as it provides our children with a strong sense of identity and belonging. Our School Policy for uniform is based on the thoughts that school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school.
- Creates a sense of community and belonging.
- Makes children feel to their peers in terms of clothing.
- Is regarded as suitable clothing for school and represents good value for money for parents.
- Is designed with health and safety in mind

The Haydon Wick Primary School Uniform consists of:

#### Boys:

White shirt/Polo shirt

Dark Trousers (charcoal/grey) (grey shorts can be worn in summer)

School sweatshirt (or maroon equivalent)

Maroon Fleece

Black shoes

#### Girls:

White blouse/Polo shirt

Dark trousers/skirt (charcoal/grey) (red & white summer dress can be worn in summer) School sweatshirt/cardigan (or maroon equivalent)

Maroon Fleece

Black shoes

The PTA have a good selection of high quality, pre-loved uniform. Please ask at the office if you are interested.

Please ensure all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name.



# SUNNY WEATHER GUIDANCE

Hopefully there will be some warmer and sunnier weather this term. It nice to see the sun, but we must be prepared to protect children from the harmful UV rays the sunshine brings. To enjoy the sun safely, please follow the advice below.

- Provide your child with a hat (please make sure it is named)
- A water bottle with water in. Water is the best fluid to keep children hydrated
- Please apply sun cream (at least SPF30) to your child, before they come to school. Older children may be able to reapply during the day
- An inexpensive pair of sunglasses can be useful too.

We have shady areas within our school grounds, so we can keep children out of the sun at the hottest parts of the day (if they are outside).
