Salt Dough Playdough Recipe

You will need:

2 cups flour 1 cup salt 1 cup water Food colouring (optional)

Method

1. Mix together the flour and salt in a large mixing bowl.

2. If desired, add 5-10 drops of food colouring to 1 cup of water.

3. Stir the water into the flour and salt in the large bowl.

Roll out the dough on a flat surface and knead it together. It should be soft and pliable.

5. Make models and ornaments.

The dough can be left to air dry or dried in a low oven 120-150°C. The time the dough takes to dry will depend on the size and thickness of your creations.
