Purple Class End-of-Year Treat


On Tuesday 8th July, Purple Class celebrated the end of Year 6 with an exciting trip to Surrey Docks Farm and Pizza Hut!

Peer Support Program at Haymerle School – Summer Term

This summer term, Haymerle School proudly launched a Peer Support Program, with over 20 students from across the school taking part. Led by four dedicated support leaders, Aakeem, Helena, James, and Esther – the program aimed to build community, develop social skills, and foster meaningful peer relationships.

Each week, support leaders worked with small groups of pupils, engaging in structured 20-minute sessions designed to build confidence, promote emotional wellbeing, and encourage positive social interactions. Prior to these sessions, leaders met with staff to plan and prepare activities tailored

Museums with Quiet or Sensory-Friendly Sessions

- Dawnosaurs at the Natural History Museum Free early-morning sessions for neurodivergent children (ages 5–15) with calming adjustments and facilitator support. Booking required.
- Early Birds at the Science Museum Quiet sensory-friendly visits on selected weekends; exhibits and volumes adjusted. Free entry but booking essential.
- Morning Explorers at Museum of London Docklands SEN-friendly sessions (next one around 17 August) before regular opening hours. Free, but reserve in advance.

Interactive Attractions in Calmer Settings

- London Transport Museum Early Explorer Mornings Early access with reduced sounds and sensory support; children under 18 go free, carers free.
- SENsory Sailors at National Maritime Museum Creative monthly sessions led by disabled artists tailored to autistic kids and families; ages under 13. Free but must pre-book.

Green Spaces & Parks with Sensory Benefits

- Springfield Park, Tooting Recently opened public park featuring sensory gardens, ponds, amphitheatre, and calm play areas. Free access.
- Coram's Fields, Bloomsbury Inclusive playground with paddling pool, sensory garden and wheelchair-accessible play gear. Free entry.

SEN-Friendly Screenings & Workshops

- BFI & Odeon Relaxed Screenings Sensory-aware cinema environment: dim lighting, no trailers, relaxed rules. Check schedules and booking info.
- In-store art and pet workshops Free creative sessions at places like Lego,
