Although our designated sports coach was on maternity leave from September 2022-May 2023, the PE curriculum was delivered by class teachers through the PE passport app linked to the implementation plan. The pupils are continuing to develop existing basic skills and these standards have been maintained during the period of time our sports coach was not at school. There were no sporting after school clubs delivered during the period of time Miss Hayward was on maternity leave, but sports sessions were delivered for both KS1 and KS2 by the Year 6 Sports Leaders and Mrs Wallsworth (PE subject lead) took teams to a variety of different competitions during the year. We have maintained the Schools Games Gold award for the last three years and we be focusing on achieving Platinum this school year. Our sports coach continues to has work closely with the PE subject leader to create a clear vision of physical education across the school, as well as a concise view of where this subject is heading over the next twelve months including participating in more Rochdale Association competitions, encouraging more children to take part in out of school clubs and the reintroduction of Change4Life club to target those children who are reluctant to participate in physical education.</p> <p><b>Desired Outcomes:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To continue to enhance the quality and quantity of extra-curricular sports provision across the school, including the attendance of SEN and pupil premium pupils, with an aim of 70% of all pupils engaging in at least one club throughout the year.</li> <li>2. To maintain the school’s success at inter school tournaments and sports competitions and give an opportunity to a wider range of children through the use of friendly competitions. Aim to win at least three competitions.</li> <li>3. Increase pupil self-esteem, pride in the school and love for physical education and sport inside and outside of the school setting.</li> <li>4. Invest in more fitness trackers for KS2 to encourage higher levels of activity amongst these pupils.</li> <li>5. Continue to develop the Sports Leaders programme in school.</li> </ol>

- Pupil perception questionnaires measuring the interest of children in different areas of the PE curriculum.

The sustainability of our work to promote P.E. and Sport across school plays a fundamental role in our planning for provision.

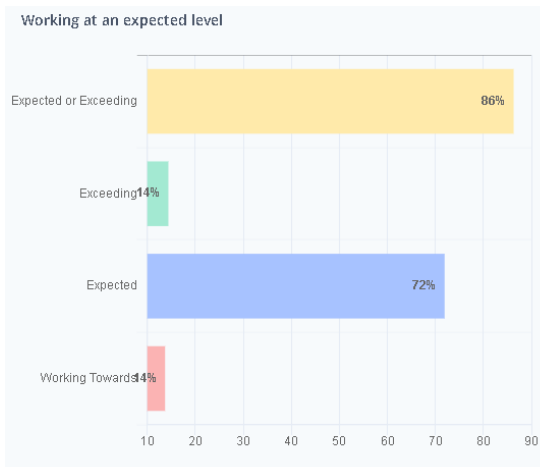

## Assessment Update:

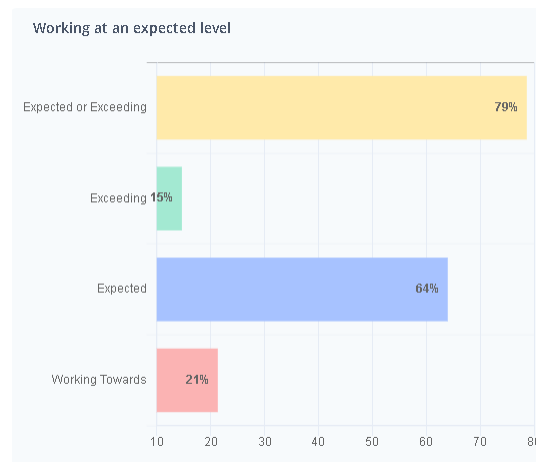
Assessments are complete and data has been inputted into PE Passport app, which each member of teaching staff has access to.

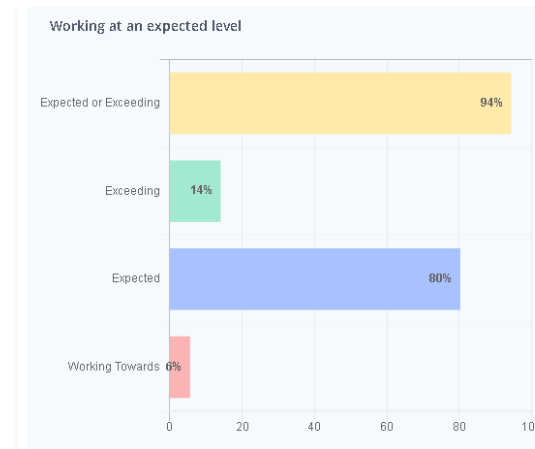

**Swimming data:** Swimming resumed on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2023 at Heywood Sports Village. We made the decision to take all of Year 4 plus the Year 5 and Year 6 pupils who did not achieve 25m last year.

### Swimming Data:

- 81% can swim competently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- 81% can use a range of strokes effectively.
- 81% can perform a safe self-rescue in different water situations.
