PE and Sport Premium

School Context:

The sports coach continues to have a positive impact on the Physical Education within the school. Although our designated sports coach was on maternity leave from September 2024-May 2025, the PE curriculum was delivered by class teachers through the PE passport app linked to the implementation plan. The success of this period is further evidence of the impact of continuous CPD and staff development through the use of our sports premium. The pupils are continuing to develop existing basic skills and these standards have been maintained during the period of time our sports coach was not at school. We have maintained the Schools Games Gold award for the last three years and we be focusing on achieving Platinum this school year. Our sports coach continues to has work closely with the PE subject leader to create a clear vision of physical education across the school, as well as a concise view of where this subject is heading over the next twelve months including participating in more Rochdale Association competitions, encouraging more children to take part in out of school clubs and the reintroduction of Change4Life club to target those children who are reluctant to participate in physical education.

Desired Outcomes:

- 1. To continue to enhance the quality and quantity of extra-curricular sports provision across the school, including the attendance of SEN and pupil premium pupils, with an aim of 70% of all pupils engaging in at least one club throughout the year.
- 2. To maintain the school's success at inter school tournaments and sports competitions and give an opportunity to a wider range of children through the use of friendly competitions. Aim to win at least three competitions.
- 3. Increase pupil self-esteem, pride in the school and love for physical education and sport inside and outside of the school setting.
- 4. Continue to develop the Sports Leaders programme in school.
