Interesting facts

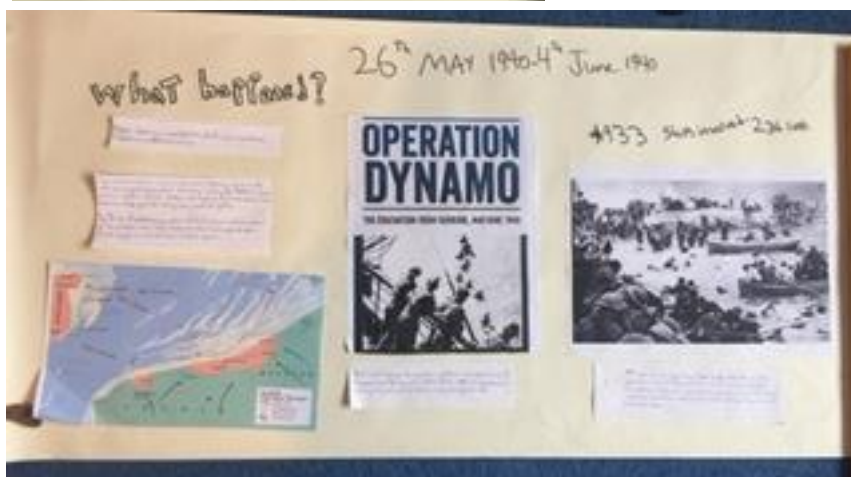
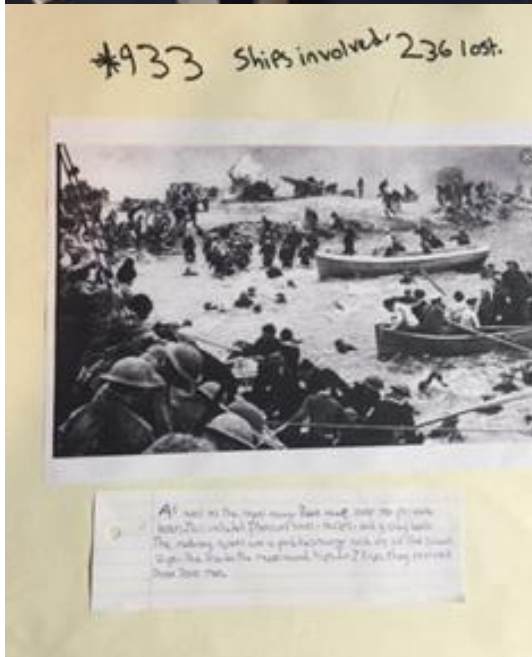
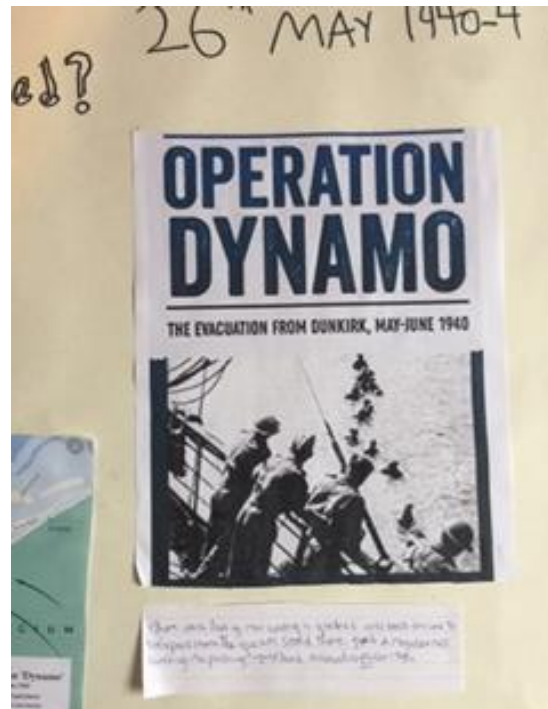
- At least 1,000 British planes were shot down

Bethany has been in touch and has done both science and English- well done!

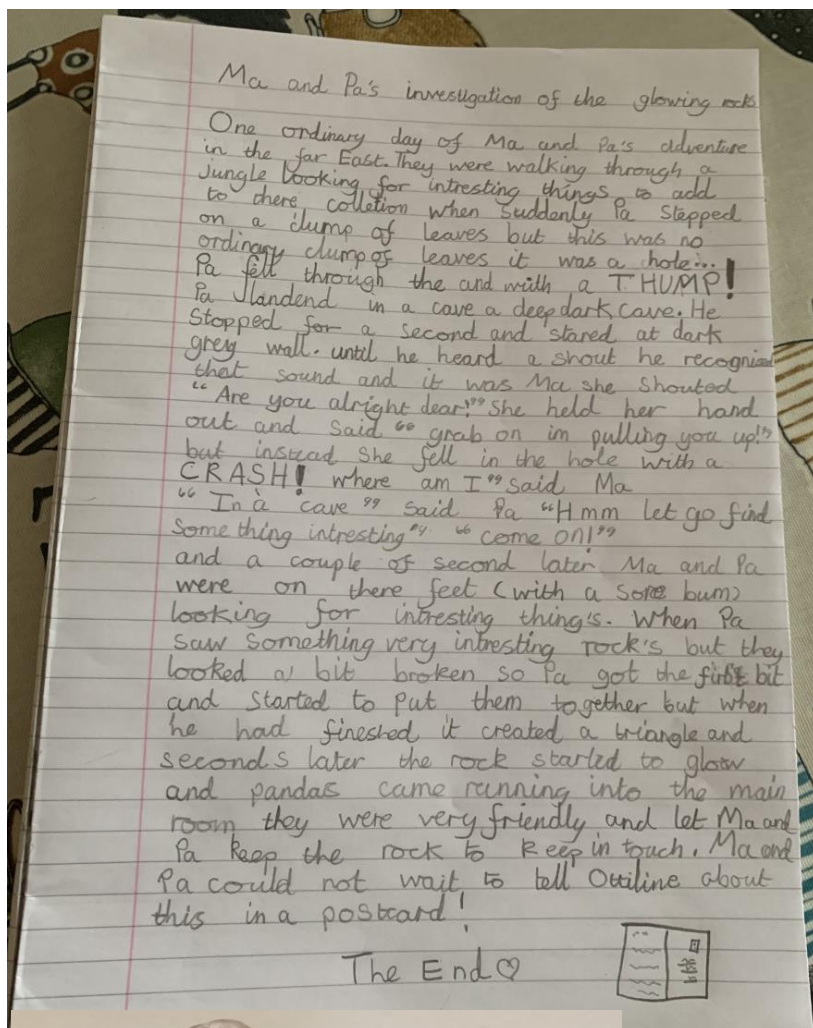
Hi Mrs Hodgson,
