


HEYHOUSES ENDOWED C.E. PRIMARY SCHOOL


I look like Piglet from Piglet's Big Movie, after Piglet has been bathed and brushed- just less pink!



I am joking children, before any of you start to worry!




There has been lots of hard work going on in school today. And I have been receiving lots of fantastic emails from Home Learners.




